

From the Rev'd

You will probably be reading this just after the end of March and I hope that you were able to engage with the celebrations on Easter Sunday of what is vital about the Christian faith, namely that light always, and in the end, triumphs over darkness. If you didn't manage to get to any of the services, I hope you may have been able to use your parish church for your own private quiet time and prayer. Apart from regular Sunday worship, and baptisms, weddings, and funerals, that is what the church building is there for - for you to use whenever you want to, whenever you need to. Please just come in; make use of the space for some quietness, away from all the busyness of life.

Everyone needs to do that from time to time. We are so fortunate, though, in where we live. If you are feeling anxious about something, take the time to notice the beauty of the countryside in which we are living...

I know it doesn't pay the bills, it doesn't put fuel in your car, it doesn't put food on the table, or warmth into our homes, but there are signs of new life everywhere we look in nature, which is encouraging. It can give us hope. It can help us to put things into perspective.

We need to hang onto this Easter hope, that all will be well, that God has a loving purpose for the world, especially as we continue to see such devastation in Ukraine and Gaza and, of course, grave shortcomings elsewhere in the world, whether of war, persecution, tyranny, or famine.

However hard things can seem at times, a new sunrise or new growth in the garden, new-born lambs out in the fields, a smile and a kind word from a friend, neighbour or even a stranger, , show that this is a new day, with new opportunities, with new hope. "This is the day that the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it." Take time to notice the good things and rejoice in them. And provide that smile yourself for someone else, too; they might really need it.

Jesus was saying this sort of thing when he urged us to live fully in the moment and not to worry excessively about the future. Of course, it is right to take care over doing things properly, and we need to think ahead, but (he says) 'Don't fret.' Don't be consumed by worry or anxiety. This is the call to trust in God, to have faith in Him. Let us do all that we can to be ready, and then let 'God be God'.

From the History Recorder: Suffolk Superstars

From every walk of life Suffolk can lay claim to some fascinating historical and contemporary figures – her are a few...Cardinal Thomas Wolsey, King Henry VIII's chief adviser, politician, Cardinal and close confident to the King. Born in Ipswich 550 years ago, he attended Ipswich School and later Magdalene College Oxford. In 1515 he was appointed Lord Chancellor and later made Bishop of Lincoln and then Archbishop of York. With the wealth from these positions, he built Hampton Court Palace, Christchurch College in Oxford and started Cardinal's College in Ipswich although the King stopped any further building work after their relationship deteriorated when he failed to secure an annulment for the King from Catherine of Aragon his first wife so Henry could marry Anne Boleyn In 1529, Wolsey was stripped of his government office and property and accused of treason; he fell ill and died on 29 November 1530 before being tried. The 'Thomas Wolsey 550' project was launched by Ipswich Council in March 2023 to recognise and celebrate the 550th anniversary of the birth of Cardinal Thomas Wolsey (c1473-1530) will finish in September 2024. Beniamin Britten was born in Lowestoft and educated at Old Buckenham Hall School and in 1927 he began private lessons in music that would be the beginning of his world-famous musical career. He founded the Aldeburgh Festival, an English arts festival devoted mainly to classical music.

George Orwell author of Nineteen Eighty-Four and Animal Farm, is considered one of the 20th Century's best narrators of English culture. His family lived in Southwold where he wrote A Clergyman's Daughter based on his life as a teacher

Ed Sheeran singer-songwriter, broke through commercially in June 2011

when his debut single "The A Team" got to number 3 in the UK chart. He was born in Halifax, West Yorkshire to Irish and English parents, before



moving to Framlingham, Suffolk. He learned guitar at a very young age and began writing songs during his time at Thomas Mills High School. He supports his community and has helped to fund a music department at Sir Robert Hitcham's Primary School.

Griff Rhys Jones presenter, comedian and documentary maker lives in Holbrook with a garden sloping down the banks of the River Stour, on the Shotley Peninsular. As a keen sailor Jones has brought the magic of sailing yachts to life through programmes such as Three Men in a Boat and the BBC series River Journeys, which have featured the River Orwell and Pin Mill. John Peel the influential DJ and radio presenter lived in Suffolk for 33 years, he is buried in St Andrew's Church, Great Finborough. The John Peel Centre for Creative Arts, the former Corn Exchange building in Stowmarket, is a top quality centre for creative arts established in his honour. *Next month in the Crier read about some famous Suffolk women.

Apologies for the lack of content from the Parish Council on the March edition of the Crier as the Clerk mistakenly sent the submission from February 2023 to which our brilliant Editor spotted and removed to save any embarrassment to which the Clerk is truly grateful. A copy of the submission will also be made available through the parish council / village website.

For information: The Clerk will be on annual leave from $4^{th} - 15^{th}$ April inclusive but will be accessing emails.

Councillor Vacancy – Old Newton

The Parish Council is delighted to announce we have filled the vacancy for the position of Councillor on the Parish Council for Old Newton by Co-Option. Mr Stephen Hammond agreed to become a Councillor at the February meeting.

Parish Precept - Precept has been submitted and acknowledged by BMSDC for Old Newton with Dagworth & Gipping. the requested total amount of £31,511.52. The precept will be paid in 2 equal instalments in April and September – This shows on their tax base calculator as a total increase of 6.20% which is what will show on the new council tax invoices that parishioners will receive.

<u>Greenacres / Church Road Development.</u> - The Parish Council secured a meeting with the Developer and they attended our February meeting. Another meeting will be set up and regular liaison has been promised moving forward. Summary notes from this meeting have been circulated to ClIrs and the representatives from Keepmoat. If any residents have any issues or comments / concerns, please liaise with the parish council Clerk who has relevant contact details and can facilitate discussions with the developer on your behalf if needed. Currently discussions regarding the new footpath on the boundary of the development and the flooding occurring in the gardens of neighbouring properties on Church Road – Discussions with Keepmoat to be continued. District ClIrs and Planning at BMSDC are also being made aware of issues being experienced. <u>Neighbouring Parish Liaison</u> – A meeting took place on 23rd January at Haughley Pavilion. Representatives were in attendance from Bacton, Haughley, Old Newton, Wetherden and Woolpit. Apologies received from Elmswell. The main issues for consideration as a group were discussed being:- Traffic – A14 remedial works / SID, Planning, Neighbourhood Plans, Footpaths and Bridlepaths and their interconnectivity between neighbouring parishes, Green corridors within and between parishes, environment, and biodiversity.

The main outcome that came from this meeting was the agreement to submit a collective response to object to the call for sites consultation. Old Newton Clerk agreed to collate responses and submit.

Collective response issued was: The villages that lie along the A14 corridor from Junction 47 to Junction 51 have, over recent years, been subjected to substantial development to the point of almost obliterating the rural nature of our villages and reducing them to mere dormitories for a commuting population. We do not feel, therefore, that it is appropriate or necessary to canvass to volunteer further sites within our parishes. We believe that our infrastructure is already overstretched and do not feel it is responsible or desirable to expand further. The existing developments need to be bedded-in within the communities before pushing for further development and Mid Suffolk should now be looking elsewhere in the county for their call for sites. Councillors firmly believe that our area of Mid Suffolk is struggling due to the lack of regular public transport services, doctors and dental surgeries, and schools that are becoming so full that students have to be transported out of their immediate area on a daily basis. All of the above are strong reasons why any further planning/development should be avoided at all costs, until such time as sufficient enhancements have been made to our local infrastructures. All our Parish Councillors believe our villages have been more that generous in accepting so much housing development but feel that this is not the time to even consider further development and any development in Parishes should be considered in accordance with their Neighbourhood Plans if applicable. The next meeting has been scheduled for May and Old Newton have agreed to host.

Allotments - The next 5 year agreement to continue using the allotment land on Station Road has been agreed with the Landowners, the Parish Council. The management agreement between ONGAA and the Parish Council is being updated.

Cemetery Works – The remedial works to the cemetery store have now been completed and paid for using CIL funds held by the parish council. The store is now future proofed for the next 20 years or so as the asbestos has been removed by a specialist contractor and the guttering has all been replaced with new plastic including soffits and any wood has been treated and repainted.

<u>Annual Parish Meeting</u> Our Annual Parish Meeting is scheduled for 24th April 2024 whereby all village organisations and groups are asked to provide their annual report. Light refreshments will be provided after the event. Could all persons submitting a report let the clerk know and where possible email the reports in order that they can be collated and uploaded onto the village website.

District Councillor's Report

MSDC 2024/25 Budget - The first Green Administration budget was agreed by Council in February. There will be a 2% increase in Council Tax for the MSDC portion. The cost of services to residents and communities is expected to rise by £1.8m, and Core Government funding is not matching the inflationary pressures, so the modest council tax increase should help protect services and build on the new priorities of the Council. The Green Administration is putting environmental sustainability and social justice at the heart of all its activities.

Housing Revenue Budget - The Housing Revenue Account budget was also agreed in February. There are financial challenges ahead, most notably an increase of £1.1m in the cost to run the housing service. The housing revenue account and council general fund account are completely separate and under current legislation it is not possible for one to subsidise the other. There will be a 7.7% increase in housing rents this year just to keep pace with rising costs. There will also be increases in both service and utility charges for sheltered housing tenants. Many tenants receive housing benefit or universal credit and due to recent increases in the rent portion of this, the majority of tenants will not see an increase in rent. Advice and help for those struggling with finances is available from the Council.

Rural Transport grants -A new rural transport grants scheme has been launched to help provide passenger transport options across the district. Existing community transport operators can apply for funding before 15th April.

Joint local plan part 2 - All parish and town councils have been invited to complete a questionnaire about the services and facilities present in each area. This information is needed to prepare the next phase of the Joint Local Plan.

Energy efficiency grants - Funding is available to help residents with the cost of installing loft insulation, in partnership with Travis Perkins. There are four product options available, and residents will receive a 50% discount on their purchase (up to ± 200), with free delivery.

Tree Cover - SCC has secured over £200K from the Government's local authority Treescapes Fund for over 1500 new trees in a bid on behalf of all Suffolk councils, including MSDC. The funding will go toward planting as well as maintaining the trees. **Sports facilities in Stowmarket** In February the MSDC planning committee granted full planning permission for the first two parts of the Stowmarket Health, Education and Leisure Facilities (SHELF) project.

The initial work includes an improved pitch for Stowmarket Rugby Club, active track, cricket nets and additional paths and fencing. The second package of work includes the construction of a new sports hall and sports pavilion.

The third part, which was granted outline permission, focuses on the construction of the wellbeing hub and associated infrastructure.

Evergreens
